

Instructions for Contributors

Lemur News publishes manuscripts that deal largely or exclusively with lemurs and their habitat. The aims of Lemur News are: 1) to provide a forum for exchange of information about all aspects of lemur biology and conservation, and 2) to alert interested people to particular threats to lemurs as they arise. Lemur News is distributed free-of-charge to all interested persons. To the extent that donations are sufficient to meet the need, the policy of free distribution will continue. Manuscripts should be sent to the editor at the address on the letterhead by mail or e-mail. Lemur News welcomes the results of original research, field surveys, advances in field and laboratory techniques, book reviews, and informal status reports from research, conservation, and management programs with lemurs in Madagascar and from around the world. In addition, notes on changes in the legal status of lemurs, public awareness programs, the availability of new educational materials (include the name and address of distributor and cost, if applicable), job announcements (paid or volunteer), and notification of newly published scientific papers, technical reports and academic theses are all appropriate contributions. Readers are also encouraged to alert Lemur News to pertinent letter-writing campaigns and other activities which may need the support of the lemur research and conservation community. Finally, Lemur News serves as a conduit for debate and discussion and welcomes contributions on any aspect of the legal or scientific status of lemurs, or on conservation philosophy.

All manuscripts should be composed either in English or French, typewritten, double spaced with generous margins, (generally 1-8 pages including references and figures), and accompanied by the text on diskette in Word format or by e-mail in RTF or as a Word document. Macros, various formats and automatic numbering provided by text processing programs, such as WORD, must be avoided. The author's name, affiliation and address must be provided; please provide fax, e-mail and pertinent telephone numbers also. Tables and figures should include brief captions. Graphics should be clear and "camera ready" (large lettering is appreciated). Subtle differences in shading should be avoided as they will not show up in the final print. Tables and figures originally not made in WORD **must not** be integrated into the WORD file but submitted as separate files saved in the respective format, e.g. Excel, Corel,.... Hard copies of figures should be provided. Please give all measurements in metric units. Please accent all foreign words carefully.

Example - journal article:

Example - dissertation:

Homewood, K.M. 1976. Ecology and Behaviour of the Tana Mangabey (*Cercocebus galeritus galeritus*). Unpubl. Ph.D. thesis, University College, London.

Maps: Maps should always be made as concise as possible and should include an inset showing the location of the area discussed in relation to its home country or continent.

Photographs: Black-and-white prints are ideal. Original color slides from which we can make prints are also acceptable. However, please send only sharply-focused, high quality slides and photographs. Please label each slide or photograph with the photographer credit and number the identifying caption. Captions should be listed on a separate sheet, or after "Literature Cited". We are always interested in receiving high quality photographs for our covers, especially those of little known and rarely photographed primates, even if they do not accompany an article.

All Figures: Please indicate on all figures the title and author of the manuscript to which they belong and package them carefully to avoid damage in the post. Figures will only be returned at the special request of the author. Maps, photographs and figures can sent in any one of the following types of file: EPS, TIF, JPG. Please, however supply a hard copy of all drawn maps or figures, preferably in the size in which they should be published.
